



## GENERAL PLAY SCORES

General Play (Casual Round) Scores provide an alternative way to submit Scores for handicap purposes and augment the information derived from competition play. They are similar to the old Supplementary Scores prior to introduction of the World Handicap System.

They can provide more evidence of playing ability, recognising that the more scores entered onto a player's **Scoring Record**, the more accurate their handicap will be.

- Scores may be submitted over 18 holes or 9 holes (front 9 or back 9)
- Men may play from the white, yellow or red tees.
- Women may play from the red or yellow tees.
- Scores cannot be submitted when playing in a pairs/team competition.

*The method of recording and returning scores to the Committee has been modified during the Covid-19 restrictions, as follows:*

1. Register your intention to submit a General Play Score **before** the round by signing in on **HowDidiDo** or at the **PSI screen** (when it is back in use).
2. Scores may be recorded by either written or electronic means, but do not physically exchange scorecards with anyone else.
3. Play in stableford format using your full Course Handicap stroke allowance and pick up your ball when you cannot score any points on a hole (if in doubt about your strokes, putt out).

4. Keep a record of your own scores and ask a playing partner to also record your scores.
5. After the round verbally agree the scores with your playing partner and submit your hole by hole scores via the PSI screen (if in use) or HowDidiDo **Mobile Score Entry** (MSI) - see separate guidance on this.

### **Note**

If you don't have access to PSI or MSI you may submit scores as follows:

1. Before playing register your intention to submit a General Play Score by emailing:

2. After the round email your Name, Course Handicap, Marker's name, gross scores on each hole and (preferably) the total points scored for each nine holes to the same email address.

A suggested layout for the email is shown below:

**Total 31 pts**

*Note: you may include more than 1 player's scores in the same email.*
