

Slope Rating

EXPLAINED

What is it?

- A number which indicates the relative playing difficulty of a course from a specific set of tees

Why is it important?

- It's a key component in strokes received calculations and enables acceptable scores from any rated golf course in the world to be submitted





- Each golf course has a Slope Rating value between 55 and 155
- The higher the slope, the more strokes a player is likely to receive
- Slope Ratings are gender specific

If you have played golf in Europe or the USA you will probably have seen references to Slope Rating on the scorecard and wondered what does this mean?

Slope Rating is a number that indicates the relative playing difficulty of a course from a specific set of tees. It has nothing to do with the number of hills on the course - if that was the case, Mapperley would have a very high Slope Rating!

In the previous article we learnt about **Course Rating**, the expected score on a course for a Scratch player (0 handicap) and **Bogey Rating**, the expected score on a course for a Bogey player (20 handicap). Knowing the Course Rating and Bogey Rating for any set of tees allows a straight line to be drawn between the two. The line can be used to determine the expected score for a player of any handicap.



Note: the picture is for illustration purposes only (not actual values)

The bigger the difference between Course Rating and Bogey Rating, the steeper the gradient of the line, hence the term **Slope Rating**.

Slope Rating values range from 55 to 155, with 113 being the value indicating a course of 'standard' relative difficulty.

How does Slope Rating affect your handicap?

The Slope Rating is a key component in the calculation of the number of strokes each player receives when playing a particular golf course. The higher the Slope Rating, the more strokes will be received.

The Course Ratings and Slope Ratings for Mapperley are shown in the extract from our Course Rating Certificate below:

You will see that there are also ratings for the front 9 and back 9 which will allow 9 hole scores for handicap purposes to be submitted from either nine.
